As we prepare for Summer 2024, I want to thank you for your continued support of Sawyerville. Your gifts are a sign of your love for God and your neighbor. When you support Sawyerville, you nourish the partnership between the Episcopal Diocese of Alabama and the Hale County community, a partnership built on trust.

Thirty years ago, a sign offering a free summer camp was taped to the door of the community center in the small town of Sawyerville. Local residents trusted the promise made in that sign, and what began as a week-long Bible school with 70 campers is now a month-long program with over 600 participants and 300 staff. We continue to build trust in this partnership by creating meaningful spaces where Episcopalians and Hale County folks can spend time together in service, worship, and fellowship.

Sawyerville has become one of the largest ministries in our diocese, and it focuses on loving children and youth, service to God and others, and racial healing. No one understands this better than our high-schoolage Summer Camp staff. They sleep on air mattresses in the gym, wake up early, shepherd campers through a busy camp day, clean the campus, and worship together—all in one day. Workshops are held to discuss race relations, healthy relationships, and what it means to serve when you are tired. It's a transformative experience for so many.

For campers and students, I believe they see this partnership most clearly in the pool. This is where something extraordinary happens—trust. The eyes of a camper look into the eyes of a high school staff person and a commitment is made. 'I trust you to keep me afloat and teach me to swim.' This is transformation through trust. This bond will continue to bring campers and staff to Sawyerville for years to come.

SUMMER CAMP





Celebrating its 30th year, Summer Camp welcomed 675 campers and 251 staff members over three sessions. Of the staff, 98 were previous campers indicative of the success of the program and its goal to create lifelong connections in the lives of campers.





Other successes from the summer include the \$44,383 raised in our Summer Challenge fundraiser, and the continued support from local and Diocesan parishes that makes Summer Camp possible.





SUMMER LEARNING

Adding rising fifth and sixthgrade students to the
program this year, Summer
Learning nearly tripled in
size with 104 students
completing the program
and 29 certified teachers
serving over three weeks.
According to the STAR test,
on average, students gained
2 months of learning in
reading and 2 ½ months of
learning in math.





Students were able to receive core academic intervention in reading and math, in accordance with the Alabama Literacy Act and Alabama Numeracy Act, and still have daily rotations of enrichment on the playground and Fridays at the pool!









JUMP START





In partnership with United
Way of West Alabama,
Sawyerville JumpStart helps
prepare students for
Kindergarten. This summer,
JumpStart also saw growth,
welcoming 22 students over
four weeks of half-day
programming—the largest
number of students to date!





This year, students practiced writing their names and worked with numbers, shapes, and colors. For enrichment and fun, JumpStart made ice cream, played on the playground, and had their very first Water Day, which was a big hit!











PERSON2PERSON

Person2Person welcomed 12
participants and staff from all over
the state. High school students,
college students, and adults spent
Martin Luther King, Jr. weekend
learning about the history of race in
Alabama and discerning how
Christians are called to improve race
relations now.

The group stayed at St. John's
Episcopal Church and visited the
National Memorial for Peace and
Justice, the Legacy Museum,
Freedom Rides Museum, Civil Rights
Memorial, and the Harris House. They
also had meaningful worship at St.
Paul AME Church.

During the 2022-2023 school year,
5 juniors and seniors from
Greensboro High School were paired with 5 young adult mentors who helped prepare them for life after high school graduation.

Mentoring events included a Meet & Greet, College Readiness Workshop, and a Life Skills Workshop. At the end of the year, our mentors attended Greensboro High School's graduation in support of graduating mentees and presented them with their graduation gift from Sawyerville, a new laptop!
